SECOND SCHEDULE

GOODS NOT REGARDED AS TOYS

- 1) Festival decorations.
- 2) Public playground equipment.
- 3) Sporting goods and equipment, camping goods, athletic equipment, musical instruments and furniture.
- 4) Aguatic equipment intended to be used in deep water.
- 5) Collectible products not intended for children under fourteen years of age.
- 6) Toys installed in public places (shopping centres, arcades, etc.)
- 7) Jigsaw puzzles having more than 500 pieces or without a picture, for specialists.
- 8) Compressed air and gas operated guns and pistols.
- 9) Fireworks including percussion caps, except percussion caps specifically designed for toys.
- 10) Slingshots.
- 11) Darts with metallic points.
- 12) Electric ovens, irons or other functional products operated at a nominal voltage greater than 24 V.
- 13) Products containing heating elements intended for use under the supervision of an adult in a teaching context.
- 14) Models of aircrafts, rockets, boats and land vehicles powered by combustion engines.
- 15) Toy steam engines.
- 16) Bicycles, except bicycles with a maximum saddle height of 435 mm.
- 17) Video toys which can be connected to a video screen and which are operated at a voltage exceeding 24 V.
- 18) Babies' dummies.
- 19) Faithful reproduction of real firearms.
- 20) Fashion jewellery for children.
- 21) Model kits, hobby and craft items in which the finished item is not primarily of play value and not intended for children under fourteen years of age.
- 22) Bows for archery with an overall relaxed length exceeding 120 cm.
- 23) Kites, except kites with strings which have electrical resistance properties.
- 24) Amusement machinery.
- 25) Portable child-appealing luminaires.

For the avoidance of doubt, any toys which are the counterparts of any goods specified in the Second Schedule shall be subject to the safety standards as prescribed by the Ministry.
